Dear Parent/Guardian,

Vaccines are a safe, effective way to protect your child from potentially serious infectious diseases.

While immunization rates remain high in Canada, many students fell behind on routine immunizations during the COVID-19 pandemic. This has opened the door to a <u>potential resurgence</u> of some vaccine-preventable diseases.

Grey Bruce Public Health has already seen noteworthy cases of vaccine-preventable diseases in neighbouring Health Units. For instance, both Huron-Perth and Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health reported in March higher-than-normal pertussis cases among children. Toronto and Middlesex-London health units both investigated single travel-related cases of measles in 2023.

As we approach the summer break, Grey Bruce Public Health is urging parents to ensure their children are up to date on all routine, publicly funded immunizations as soon as possible.

Doing so will help to prevent vaccine-preventable disease outbreaks this summer, ensure your child has a safe and healthy break, and is ready for school in the fall.

<u>Ontario's Publicly Funded Immunization Schedule</u> outlines the immunizations that are available through the province's free immunization program. Unless your child has a valid exemption, they must be immunized against the following diseases to attend primary and secondary school:

- Diphtheria
- Tetanus
- Polio
- Measles

- Mumps
- Rubella
- Meningitis (meningococcal disease)
- Pertussis (whooping cough)
- Chickenpox (if born in 2010 or later.

The <u>Immunization of School Pupils Act</u> mandates Public Health Units to maintain and review immunization records for every student attending school within their jurisdiction and enforce a suspension for students with incomplete immunization information or who have not received a required immunization.

GBPH intends to begin this suspension process in the new school year.

If your child is up to date on all required immunizations, please ensure their immunization record with **Public Health is also updated.** Parents/guardians must report immunization information to Public Health.
